Pupil Premium Funding 2017/2018

For the academic year 2017/2018 the school receives £10,400 in pupil premium funding.

This money is for the purpose of narrowing the attainment gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers, ensuring that all pupils have the best possible learning experience, irrespective of personal circumstances and socio-economic background.

The table below sets out the plans the school have drawn up to spend this money, as well as the intended impact.

Action	Funding allocation	Intended Impact
Purchase of additional teaching assistant hours to support targeted pupils in order to raise standards in key literacy and numeracy skills.	£2,500 (24% of allocation)	Those pupils who are in receipt of pupil premium funding will make accelerated progress in Maths and English as a result of this additional support. This will be measurable through end of year assessment data though progress will also be check throughout the course of the year.
School will fund the annual residential trip to PGL for those pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 who are entitled to pupil premium funding.	£360 (3% of allocation)	Identified pupils will be able to access the same broad enrichment curriculum as their non-disadvantaged peers. This will enable those pupils to develop skills of risk taking, perseverance and wider social interaction that would otherwise not be available to them were it not for the pupil premium.
School will fund additional teaching hours to ensure that pupils entitled to the pupil premium are taught in very small, targeted groups, allowing them to make the maximum possible progress in literacy and mathematics.	£7540 (72.5% of allocation)	Pupils entitled to pupil premium funding will narrow the attainment gap between themselves and their non-disadvantaged peers in Maths and English, thus positioning them to begin secondary education on the best possible footing.
