

# Treales Church Of England Primary School Newsletter 5– Friday 11th November 2022



Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

We have made a great start to the half term.

Years 3, 4 and 5 are enjoying their swimming sessions at St Annes pool. Chloe from AFC has joined us on Thursday and Fridays. She is working with children at lunchtimes and after school and supporting staff in PE lessons.

During some PE lessons KS2 children will be using hockey sticks and balls to support their learning and develop fundamental skills. This can pose a mouth injury risk. The school seeks to adhere to protecting its students by following guidance from sports governing bodies about making the importance of wearing of mouth guards known to all pupils and parents. We refer to Safe Practice in Physical Education (2020) handbook, which state that: Mouth guards are recommended for hockey at all levels of participation. If you wish for your child to wear a mouth guard, please ensure these are brought to school and return home for cleaning on PE days. It is recommended that a type or style of mouth guard is advised for parents, by either themselves or their child's qualified dentist, wherever possible. Teachers and coaches are not qualified to assess the quality and standard of a mouth guard. This remains the responsibility of the parent and/or guardian. A child without a guard will still be able to fully take part in PE lessons as the safety points are explicitly taught and dynamic risk assessments take part throughout the lesson. This information will be included in our PE and Uniform policy.

Elder Class have begun their work to become playground leaders with Lee Cadwallader from Fylde and Wyre Sport Partnership. They have some brilliant ideas and are going to be great leaders.

Elder Class are also enjoying their lessons with James Bovenizer from The Faith mission. They are 'walking' through the Old Testament and have learnt lots of new information.

This afternoon Dr Roberts came to renew our planters with the help of some of the children – we are looking forward to seeing the daffodils grow over the spring.





Every child has decorated their own poppy this week and we have used them in our Remembrance worship this afternoon. These will now be used to make wreaths to lay in church during Treales Praise this Sunday. Children have learnt a new song and we have recorded this to be played in the service.

We have begun to learn our nativity 'The Amazing Advent Calendar'. Older children have received part of the script to being to learn and we will communicate information regarding your child's part and any costume requirements next week.

Next week we have our trip to Kirkham Grammar School for Willow and Elder Class. If you have not paid for a book and wish for your child to bring a book home, please pay by 9am on Monday.

And we have also been continuing our usual learning too!

There have been lots of absences due to illness. There seems to be a sickness bug and flu type bug in school affecting staff and children. Please do try to send your child to school where possible (48 hours absence from last sickness is required) – we will always contact you if we have any concerns.

The Light Party was a huge success and the children and adults all got stuck in to crafts and running around in the dark with alow sticks!



£2489! Thank you to everyone who helped man the gates and sell drinks, along with everyone who came to support the event! And once again, a huge, huge thank you to Pete!


Thank you to everyone who donated to our Bag2School textile collection. We have just received cheque for £100 following this which is a great result.


