


Dear All,



LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Everyone is invited to take part in a survey to help shape future plans for cycling and walking in Lancashire.

Lancashire County Council, in partnership with Blackpool Council, want to join up the gaps in our existing network of footpaths and cycle routes and provide safer, direct and more convenient routes.

Following feedback from the initial public engagement last year, the councils have produced a draft network map of cycling and walking routes in Lancashire. They need people from all areas of the county to provide feedback on anything you think could be improved. The survey will be available on their website until 24 October 2023.

Additional design and feasibility work will be needed to take any of the proposed schemes forward. You can find out more and take part in the survey at <u>www.lancashire.gov.uk/activetravel</u>.

PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY FAULTS

Please report any problems via the Love Clean Streets app and website. You will need to register. A list of categories will appear for you to choose. Initially you will be unable to track the progress of your reports but that facility will hopefully be added soon.

SPEEDING VEHICLES

In order for LCC and the Police to consider our request for speed reduction measures we have to provide detailed evidence. It is vital therefore to report whatever you witness as follows:

- Speed concerns and general incidents of inconsiderate driving. Report online to Lancashire Road Safety Partnership on lancsroadsafetypartnership.co.uk. Then report same incident as detailed below.
- General incidents of inconsiderate driving, near misses, mobile phone use etc. Report directly via phone to 101 or email Kirkham.NPT@lancashirepolice.uk giving details including date, time and location.
- Collisions, vehicles through hedges etc. Report via phone to 101 or via email to accident.clerks@lancashirepolice.uk Giving details including date , time and location.
